Key Knowledge and Skills Key Vocabulary Textiles - Combining different fabric shapes Definition Word pass a thread through the eye of a needle threading a row of stitches sewn on to cloth stitching a letter of an ancient Germanic alphabet, related to the Roman alphabet Runes fabric, come up through the middle of the long stitch you have just made. As you come up make your needle split the thread and sew through it. Now your needle is at the front o the fabric, continue with another long running stitch. Repeat. Connect together joining Drawstring a string in the seam of the material of a garment or a bag, which can be pulled to tighten or close it a long, thin strand of cotton, nylon, or other fibres used in sewing or weaving thread Start with a running stitch and bring the needle up to the front of the fabric, a sho distance to the right of your running stitch. Instead of sewing on, sew back to fill in the gap. Now, bring your needle to the front of the fabric, a short distance from your last stitch. Sew back to fill in the gap. Repeat. a very fine slender piece of metal with a point at one end and a hole or eye for needle thread at the other, used in sewing The Alphabet in Viking Runes cloth or other material produced by weaving or knitting fibres. fabric a line along which two pieces of fabric are sewn together in a garment or other seam article Gap between the edge of the fabric and the row of stitching creating the seam Seam allowance

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
