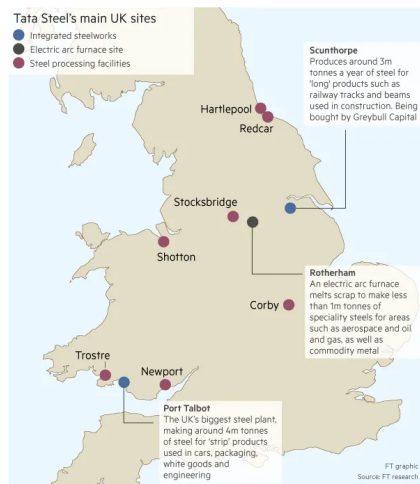

Steel Production

Physical Features

Physical features are natural. We need to remember that physical features are the things that would be here even if humans were not. Lakes, mountains, rivers and oceans are physical features.



Human Features

Human features are things that have been built by people. Houses, roads, bridges and other buildings are examples of human features.

Word	Definition
Distribution centres	A product storage and shipping building that stores goods a company produces.
County	A political division of the UK, forming the largest unit of local government. A county usually consists of several towns and local areas that surround them.
Landscape	A large area of countryside.
Human features	Natural features like rivers, lakes, mountains and oceans.
Physical features	Man-made features that have been built by people.
Local area	The village, city or town where you live.
Pollution	Damage caused to water, air etc. by harmful substances or waste.
Trade	The activity of buying and selling goods between people or countries.
Construction	The action of building something, usually a large structure.
