A polite reminder regarding ParentPay – please can any monies owed be paid in full as soon as possible. We would greatly appreciate your support with this matter.

General reminders about the uniform

A reminder that children must return to school in September wearing the main academy uniform. Please see the charts on our website for the precise requirements for children at different age phases of the academy.

- In addition to the main clothing items, please remember that all pupils must have a pair of plain black plimsolls for indoor use only – this is a compulsory part of the uniform.
- A pair of plain, smart black school shoes for outdoor use is also compulsory trainers will not be accepted.
- No pupil is permitted to wear jewellery of any kind. This is for health and safety reasons and must be adhered to.
- Please ensure that all items of uniform, including footwear, are clearly labelled. With large numbers of pupils wearing identical items, labelling is essential to enable staff to return mislaid items of uniform back to their owners.
- Any parent seeking to purchase a blazer for their child, please remember that this optional item must be pre-ordered in good time from Shah's.

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Building Works

As previously announced, a new early years outdoor learning area will be constructed this summer. The side car park for staff will be relocated to the top of the playground, meaning that these cars will no longer cross the pedestrian walkway, thereby improving safety. The original plan was to construct a purpose-built car park with lighting, partly on the grass bank at the top of the playground, and partly on the playground, and which would have taken up far less of the playground than what is going to be the case.

Unfortunately, following the award of funding for both projects over 2 years ago, at a time when we were transitioning to the new Trust, we have then experienced a very long delay to the realisation of these projects which has been completely beyond the control of the school. This has resulted in the Trust informing us that our original vision for the car park is now no longer affordable. It is my hope that one day we may be able to achieve the original plan.

Despite losing a sizeable section of the playground, there will still be plenty of space for the children to play and we will continue to allow access for cars on to the playground at home time for parents of children in Early Years and Key Stage One.

Year 6 Leavers

We wish our Year 6 pupils all the best as they leave this week and move on to secondary education in September. They have been a super group of pupils and they leave with our love and best wishes. For any parents whose association with the school also comes to an end this year, I would like to extend my sincere gratitude for your support of the school over the years and we wish you and your children all the best for the future.
