Safeguarding

To discuss or report any safeguarding concerns, please speak with Miss Smith in the first instance, or one of the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads. You may also report concerns to any member of staff, as all staff have received safeguarding training, and they will then report this information to the Designated Safeguarding Leads. We assure you that all matters will be dealt with sensitively, however, depending on the information provided, it may be necessary for us to share this information with other Safeguarding Agencies.

The academy is very keen to appoint new Foundation Governors. A poster will be sent with this letter and has been placed on our website. Uniform

Thank you to all of the parents who have fully adhered to the academy's uniform policy. Your children have come back to school looking very smart. A reminder that children should be wearing the main academy uniform this term, and not the summer uniform. Please see the charts on our website for the precise requirements for children at different age phases of the academy.

- In addition to the main clothing items, please remember that all pupils must have a pair of plain black plimsolls for indoor use only – this is a compulsory part of the uniform.
- A pair of plain, smart black school shoes for outdoor use is also compulsory – trainers will not be accepted.
- Please ensure that all items of uniform, including footwear, are clearly labelled. With large numbers of pupils wearing identical items, labelling is essential to enable staff to return mislaid items of uniform back to their owners.

Jewellery

A reminder that children are not allowed to wear jewellery on site for reasons of health and safety. All children take part in sport, including contact sports, and classrooms, corridors, and the playground are busy places, all of which creates the potential for accidents if jewellery is worn. It is for this reason that we have a policy of no jewellery and this must be adhered to for the safety of all.

If, however, a child has had their ears pierced recently and needs to keep the earrings in for just a little longer, parents must cover their child's ears with plasters each day until the earrings can be removed at the earliest opportunity.

Water Bottles

A reminder that we encourage all pupils to bring a bottle of water to school each day. Drinking water throughout the day not only keeps children hydrated but also assists with concentration and ultimately learning. Please ensure that bottles are transparent and contain water only. Other types of drink will not be accepted, unless there is an exceptional reason provided by the parent and evidence may be requested by the academy. Please contact the Academy Office should you need to discuss this matter.

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Site Rules

A reminder to all parents of the following rules which help to keep our site a safe place for all:

- No **dogs** are allowed on the academy site at any time
- **Smoking** and **vaping** are not allowed on the site at any time
- **Bicycles** and **scooters**, including **motorised scooters**, must not be ridden anywhere on site; we also ask that anyone who uses a motorised scooter on Anne's Crescent takes great care when children and parents are entering and leaving the site due to the large number of people in that area.

We are grateful for your support and cooperation in helping to keep everyone safe.

Dropping Off and Collecting Children

A reminder that only parents of children in Classes 1–6 should accompany their children on site in a morning, and in the same way come on to the site at home time to collect their children.

Parents of children in Classes 7–12 are asked to take their children only as far as the school gates in a morning, and to wait on Anne's Crescent at home time. This is to help ease congestion on site and we thank you for your cooperation.

Parking on Anne's Crescent

We realise that most parents park safely and legally on Anne's Crescent, but as a polite reminder, **please do not obstruct the driveways of residents**.

It is illegal to park across any driveway, and Council Wardens periodically patrol and check that rules are being adhered to and will implement a fine payable to the council when necessary. We understand that Anne's Crescent becomes congested but please remain considerate to our local residents at all times.

On-site Parking

A polite reminder that on-site parking at the front of the academy is for disabled drivers only. No other cars are allowed on-site in a morning. The front vehicular gates are closed at 8.30 a.m. to allow pedestrians to cross the driveway safely.

At home time, parents of children in **Classes 1–6 only** are encouraged to park on the playground to help ease congestion on Anne's Crescent. Gates will open from 2.40 p.m. and will close at 2.55 p.m. In the interest of safety, we kindly ask that parents switch off their car engines when parked and to remain stationary until the gates are reopened at 3.10 p.m. when all pedestrians have left the site.

One way system

For the benefit of parents new to the academy, we ask all parents in vehicles to maintain a voluntary one-way system around Anne's Crescent both in a morning and at home time. Cars should enter from the Queensway side of Anne's Crescent, and exit the crescent at the other side. This system significantly aids traffic flow, and we are grateful to parents for your ongoing cooperation with this.

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Breakfast Club

A reminder that the Breakfast Club is open each day from 7.30 a.m. and available to all year groups, including nursery, and provides a variety of breakfast options and up to one hour's childcare before the commencement of the school day for a cost of £2.50 per day. No booking is required. Your child will also take part in Wake and Shake for that day, a fun session of physical activity, which research suggests has a positive effect on pupils' learning.

After-School Clubs

After-school clubs have commenced and run on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings. A letter has been issued and includes details of the clubs on offer this term and the age groups that are able to attend them. There is a pupil limit to each club, and places are always offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

The clubs are run by staff who volunteer and I am very grateful to those staff who provide this service for you and your children. I would encourage you to strongly consider making use of these clubs as they provide some wonderful extensions of the curriculum and a chance for your children to make some new friends along the way.

Change to Class Assemblies

Class assemblies take place on Monday afternoons at 2.30 p.m. A class assembly takes place each fortnight in the Academy Hall and entrance for parents is via the Hall fire doors. When the time is approaching for your child's class assembly, you will receive an invite from your child's class teacher in good time.

We do not publish a full list of class assemblies in advance as sometimes it becomes necessary for dates to change due to a variety of unforeseen circumstances and we do not want to inconvenience parents, some of whom may book time off work to attend.

Site Improvements

Most parents by now will have seen our new outdoor Early Years Area. This area is not simply for play, but rather is an extension of the Early Years classroom and where a great deal of learning takes place for children of this age. I am delighted this latest project for the school has been delivered and we are grateful for so many positive comments from parents. We now have a fantastic space for our Nursery and Reception pupils to support their outdoor learning and the children have been greatly enjoying using the new facility. We also allowed our Key Stage 1 children to have some time in the area as we were very conscious they have just missed out on this development, and they too have greatly enjoyed their time outdoors.

Visits to Mass

All children will be attending a Mass at St. Bernadette's Catholic Church each term across the academic year. Upper Key Stage 2 (Classes 10, 11, and 12) attended Mass this morning, and parishioners commented on their outstanding behaviour and the reverence they showed in church. We were very proud of our children – well done to all.

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Musical Instrument Tuition

We are delighted to announce a new partnership with Lucy Cooper, Educator and Musician, which adds a further aspect to our Music provision. A separate letter has already been issued to parents of children in Years 2–6, who have been invited to express an interest in learning the piano, violin, or guitar. This opportunity is in addition to the musical instrument tuition that already takes place within music lessons as part of our existing curriculum. We are excited to be offering this further enhancement to our provision for pupils, which I am sure will be welcomed by parents.

Football Success

Our school attends many different sporting events over the academic year across multiple sports, and the school has recently achieved great success in football. A Scunthorpe and District Tournament for schools took place at John Leggott College last week, with girls and boys from Years 5 and 6 taking part. I'm delighted to say that both our Girls' Football Team, and our Boys' Football Team came in 1st place in their respective tournaments, and now go on to compete in regional finals.

Arbor Parent App

Thank you to the absolute vast majority of our parents who have now downloaded the Arbor Parent App. For any parents who have not yet downloaded the app, we would strongly encourage you to do so as this is the prime route of communication now between the school and parents. All parents were sent an email with a link to enable this process, but please do contact the Academy Office if you require any assistance. Thank you for your support with this matter.
