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KS1	Pentecost Term - Heroes History We learn about the life of Mary Seacole and the difficulties she faced due to the colour of her skin. UKS2	Lent Term-Furnaces of Fire DT  We learn about the architect Dame Zaha Mohammad Hadid, who was a pioneering architect in a male dominated field. This helps the children to challenge stereotypes.  PSHE-Jigsaw As part of the lessons, pupils explore their own gifts and talents, thinking about desires they have for their future.  Pentecost Term-Jurassic Jewels Geography and Science We learn about Mary Anning and her valuable contribution to paleontology. The children explore how she was not fully valued for her work in those times-linking to British Values.	Advent Term P.E. As part of the Circus dance unit, we explore social divides prejudices during the mid 19th Century.
